All links and reading material on PsalmStudy™ attempt to represent a fundamental Christian understanding of God's Holy Word when comparing Scripture with Scripture.

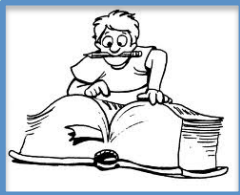
